

LODGE HISTORY

50 YEARS AGO

December 27, 1926 - "Wor. Bro. Shinn presented the following resolution an moved its adoption and it was adopted as follows; Whereas, during the long and distinguished professional career of Wor. Bro. Dr. William Morgan Smith, deceased, a Past Master of Alexandria-Washington Lodge No. 22, gave ungrudgingly and at personal sacrifice his time and exceptional talent to the relief of distressed and suffering humanity and whereas, as President of the State Board of Health and Field Secretary of the Tubercular department of the board, he devoted his efforts with eminent success to increasing the facilities and enlarging the scope of scientific treatment of tuberculosis in our state, therefore be it resolved, that the Bum of Twenty-Five Hundred Dollars or as much thereof as may be necessary, be appropriated from any funds or intangible assetts of Alexandria-Washington Lodge to fully equip, according to the most approved scientific principles, The Alpine Light Room in the Masonic pavillion being built at Blue Ridge Sanitorium."

100 YEARS AGO

December 12, 1876 - (copy in the minute book of a letter sent to St. Johns Lodge No. 36 in Richmond, Va.) "Walter Moore, Esq., Secretary, St. Johns Lodge No. 36. A.F.&A.M., Dear Brother; I have been instructed by the brethren of Alex-Wash Lodge No. 22 to tender their heart felt sympathy to St. Johns Lodge upon the occasion of the death of their beloved brother, Wor. John Dove, whose intimate acquaintance with the mysteries of our order rendered him distinguished in the Masonic world and entitled him to the veneration and respect of all masons who have enjoyed the benefit of his labors in the cause to which he had devoted so many years of his life.

The many virtues which adorned the character of the deceased brother found their crowning glory in the ready obediance to the summons of his Divine Master and his joyful departure, cheered by the hope of a glorious imortality, to unite with his redeemed brethren in singing praises to the Grand Master of the Universe......"

150 YEARS AGO

<u>December 14, 1826</u> - "This being the night for the election of the Officers for the ensuing year, on balloting the following brethren were duly elected, viz; Charles Chapin, W.M.; Joseph Eaches, S.W.; A.P. Gilpin, J.W.; John Dunlap, Sect.; Chas. T. Chapman, Treas.; R.C. Woods, Tyler, The Master-Elect appointed James Cloud and George Smoot Deacons and Presley Jacobs and Robt. Conway Stewards."
