

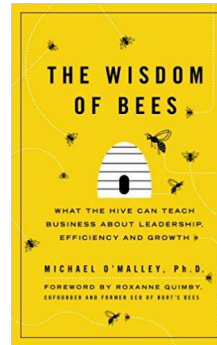

## AUGUST

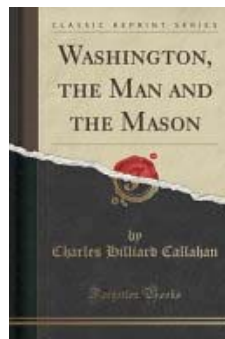

The Grand Master has provided specific guidance on reopening. Some of the guidelines are included herein. Each Worshipful Master may decide when and if to reopen for Stated Communications and Catechism Returns between now and September. We will open for July's Stated and re-evaluate before August.








**Public Health Warning:**



*No one with a fever or symptoms of COVID-19, or known exposure to COVID-19 case(s) in the prior 14 days, is permitted to enter the Lodge building. Public gatherings are not without some risk. All should exercise caution, particularly those who are 65 years of age or older, or if you have underlying health conditions.*

**Things to Know BEFORE Lodge:**

- ⇒ There will be no meal served prior to the meeting. Please arrive between 7:15 and 7:25 p.m.
- ⇒ PRACTICE SOCIAL DISTANCING. Maintain six feet between you and your brother. Seats will be marked to assist in distancing.
- ⇒ FACECOVER REQUIRED. You will be required to wear a face mask while in the Memorial. If you do not have a face covering, one will be provided for you.
- ⇒ The Memorial has been thoroughly cleaned.
- ⇒ Hand sanitizing stations, hand soap, and sanitizing wipes are available at various points throughout the Memorial and should be used.
- ⇒ Aprons are required, but gloves and sanitized wipes are available.
- ⇒ The "Word" will not be taken. Please have your dues card.
- ⇒ Disposable hand gloves should be worn for balloting. A trash can will be located along the North side of the lodge to receive used gloves have brothers have deposited their ballots.
- ⇒ Brethren will remain at their seats for the closing charge.

The following page includes information on proper face covering use and proper hygiene practices. The safety of our membership is our number one concern. If, for any reason, you feel you are unable to follow the requirement to wear a face covering, DO NOT ATTEND LODGE.

Face Covering Use		
Before/ During Use:		Before putting on a face covering, clean hands with soap and water or alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
		Inspect the condition of the face covering; usually the colored side/the side with folds facing downwards of the face covering should face outwards.
		Cover nose, mouth, and chin with the face covering. Adjust nose clip over the nose and tighten snugly; ensure there are no gaps between face and covering.
		Avoid touching the face covering. If touched, clean hands with soap and water or alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
After Use:		Remove face covering from behind using the elastics (do not touch the front of the face covering).
		Discard immediately in a trash bin; replace face covering if damp. Do not re-use single-use face coverings.
		Clean hands with soap and water or alcohol-based hand sanitizer.

Practicing Good Hygiene	
<b>Protect Yourself &amp; Others:</b> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>⇒ Stay home when sick.</li> <li>⇒ Wash hands often.</li> <li>⇒ Avoid touching eyes, nose, and mouth.</li> <li>⇒ Avoid close contact with people who are sick.</li> <li>⇒ Cover coughs &amp; sneezes with a tissue; throw the tissue in the trash.</li> <li>⇒ Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.</li> <li>⇒ Maintain at six feet between yourself &amp; others.</li> </ul>
<b>Wash Your Hands:</b> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>⇒ At least 20 second with soap and water or use an alcohol-based (60% alcohol) hand sanitizer.</li> <li>⇒ After coughing, sneezing, or blowing your nose.</li> <li>⇒ Before, during, and after preparing &amp; eating food.</li> <li>⇒ After visiting the bathroom.</li> </ul>
